December 15th, 2024, 8:30 am service – BCP 3rd Sunday of Advent

St. Alban's Anglican Church, Richmond, acknowledge with deep gratitude that we gather on the ancestral unceded lands of the Musqueam people, the hən'q'əmin'əm'language group. We acknowledge that the land on which we gather is God's land, and we seek today to live into reconciliation.

Advent is the time when the people of the Church prepare for the coming of Christ Jesus now as well as long ago in Bethlehem. There are changes in our liturgy for the next three Sundays to help us hold this special time while the world around us is racing to Christmas.

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Leader: Christ is our faith and our life.

All: May the peace of Emmanuel be with us all.

Leader: And love shine in our hearts.

All: Our joy is in the coming of the Lord.

(Three violet candles are lit.)

Leader: Let us pray: that our hope may be strengthened.

(Pause for silent prayer.)

Leader: God of our heart's desire, the warmth of Your love and our minds are searching for the light of Your Word. Increase our longing for Christ our Saviour and give us the strength to grow in our joy so that the day of His coming may find us prepared and filled with joy.

All: Amen.

OUR Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.

His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion;

And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. AMEN.
